Boat Harbour is a curving 150m long, south-facing, beach formed behind a 50m wide break in the 10-15m high sandstone rocks on the southwestern tip of the Kurnell Peninsula. It can only be reached by 4WD, boat or on foot. The narrow entrance lowers waves to less than 1m at the beach, protecting it from winds from NW through to NE, but it is exposed to southerlies. Merries Reef protects it from a NE to SE swell.

## In the event of an emergency it is essential to:

- 1. Get the casualty back on shore as quickly as possible.
- 2. Provide essential First Aid: D.R.S.A.B.C.
- 3. Call for help: Phone 000 supply requested information and follow their instructions.
- 4. Recall all divers.
- 5. Ensure all personnel are present and safe, and make your way to the agreed meeting point with Emergency Services
- 6. If appropriate phone DAN: 1800 088 200
- 7. Ensure that all dive records and dive equipment are available to medical personal as needed.
- 8. When the immediate emergency has passed and all necessary steps have been taken to assist the injured, but as soon as possible, each member of the team should make independent written notes about what happened. These notes should be as detailed and precise as possible.
